Dear Friends in Christ,

We thank you so much for your prayers for Bolivia, the Quechua, and for us. Your prayers are absolutely vital to the work here and in every place. We thank the Lord so much for all of you who take this great work of prayer seriously. Bolivia is a country that is in deep trouble politically, economically, an especially spiritually. We long to see the Lord Jesus Christ lifted up in this place through he preaching and teaching of the Holy Scriptures so that the Holy Spirit will do what Jesus has promised and draw men and women to Himself so that He will then be given the first place that He deserves to the glory of the Father, and then those whom He has delivered from darkness will become true worshippers of His in Spirit and in Truth.

We are very thankful that the Lord made it possible for us to go back to the U.S. for a short HMA (Home Ministry Assignment) about the middle of June. We returned here to Cochabamba on August 3<sup>rd</sup>. While we were home, we were able to visit 18 churches, have visits with many pastors, see many of our individual supporters, visit with friends and family, see doctors, chiropractors, and get our shots updated, along with other things that were needful. We came away very encouraged by the response of many with whom we shared by their taking seriously the urgent need to pray for God to work mightily here in Bolivia, and especially among the Quechua people.

One of our main prayer requests while we were home was for a Quechua co-laborer to come alongside and work with us in the Quechua ministry. Earl met Feliciano back in

December, 2006 at a Quechua Bible Institute in Ironqollo. They later began to study Quechua together and have since developed a very good relationship. Feliciano was converted under the ministry of New Tribes Mission about ten years ago, and he has been disciplined since then by them. Earl spoke with one of the leaders with New Tribes and received permission to talk with Feliciano about working with us in the Quechua ministry. Earl and Feliciano have now agreed to co-labor in this beginning work among the Quechua. We are very grateful to New Tribes for helping us in this great way, and we are now looking for just the right place in which to concentrate our efforts. We really need wisdom from the Lord in making this decision, so your prayers are essential in this.

We have made several survey trips since we have been back here, and we are thankful for those visits. It is truly a blessing to have someone working with us now who is a Quechua that knows their language and culture and also speaks Spanish fluently. The greatest blessing is that Feliciano seems to be a very humble Christian man with the same burden that we have to reach the Quechua people with the Gospel, see many of them converted, and then built up in “the faith once for all delivered to the saints.”

We are asking you to pray fervently for God to be at work in and through us in all of this so that we will be led by The Holy Spirit in the direction in which He would have us go so that we make our choices not on the outward appearance but by the Divine leading of our Great God. This must all be God’s work or it will surely fail, but if He is in it then it will bear fruit that remains. Thank you for your prayers.

Cecil had a heart attack about two weeks ago, underwent triple bypass surgery, and has had problems with his kidneys and been seriously ill. He is now showing some signs of improvement, but really needs your prayers.

Rosie is doing well, and is happy to be back in Cochabamba. Carla started school yesterday, August 20<sup>th</sup>. She is now in the tenth grade. Pray for her to have a good year academically, emotionally, socially, and especially spiritually, and for her to have many good Christian friends and be one herself.
